On your first visit, you will set up a login with your library card and pin.






When you log in, you will see the number of streams you have available next to your name.

You will be able to watch anything on Kanopy Kids as many times as you like. Every month you will need to click to open it again, so if you have trouble watching something, check the date. t's hard to believe that we closed our Kearsley Street building for renovation more than two years ago. For reference... that's before COVID was a word any of us knew. It's been a long time, but we are thrilled to welcome you back to Flint Public Library!

We have been working towards this day for more than five years. It is thrilling, inspiring, and humbling to think that this work will stand the test of time. The renovated Library is a testament to the people of Flint. You treasure it, you invested in it, and now it is fully renewed, ready to serve generations to come.






Family Yoga
