VITA

Saturdays • 9 AM – until spots are filled • March 4, 11, 18, 25 Registration begins at 9 AM and ends when slots are full. VITA volunteers will provide income tax assistance to those with low to moderate incomes (\$60,000 or less) filing 2022 tax returns. (No itemized deductions, business income (selfemployed), or capital gains transactions). Bring proof of income (W-2, 1099, SSI benefits), proof of identity (driver's license or state identification), and proof of Social Security number (Social Security card preferred) for every family member being claimed. Homeowners MUST bring their 2022 property tax statements for BOTH winter and summer property taxes to claim the property tax credit. Those who purchased health insurance through the Healthcare Marketplace and received advanced premium payments MUST bring Form 1095-A.
