Our "1958 time capsule" of a building is about to be re-made. The next time you enter (sometime in 2021), it will be light, bright, appealing and amazing!

TEMPORARY LOCATION: FPL AT COURTLAND CENTER

Our current building is going to be renovated from the walls in, so everything must be moved out during the construction process.

The temporary Library service location will be at Courtland Center, right next door to the temporary Sloan Museum. Moving is a big job, so we're not exactly sure how long it will take. The Library will be closed starting March 1, and we plan to open for service at our temporary location early in May. Our hours of service will be the same as they are now.

At Courtland Center, we will offer books and DVDs to check out, computer access and Wi-Fi, lots of children's programming, and as much other programming as will fit into the space! Fortunately, this location has regular bus service, plenty of parking, and hours that fit our library schedule.

A NEW CHAPTER

WHILE WE'RE MOVING: MARCH AND APRIL 2020

The Library will be closed for service during March and April. But don't despair! You can still access many Library services through our website. With your Library card, you can:

Here are some important things to know about our temporary closure:

- You can keep your checked-out materials. Nothing will come due until we re-open at Courtland Center.
- Your library card will not expire, so you can continue to download books, magazines and music.
- If you want to return materials, you can do so at our drop box on Crapo Street OR at a drop box outside the main entrance of Courtland Center.




AFRICAN AMERICAN GENEALOGY





VITA - VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE (V.I.T.A.)

Registration begins at 9 a.m. and ends when slots are full.

VITA volunteers will provide income tax assistance to those with low to moderate incomes (\$50,000 or less) filing 2019 tax returns. (No itemized deductions, business income (self-employed), or capital gains transactions). Bring proof of income (W-2, 1099, SSI benefits), proof of identity (driver's license or state identification), and proof of Social Security number (Social Security card preferred) for every family member being claimed. Homeowners MUST bring their 2019 property tax statements for BOTH winter and summer property taxes to claim the property tax credit. Those who purchased health insurance through the Healthcare Marketplace and received advanced premium payments MUST bring Form 1095-A.




